**COMPLIANCE:**

Joseph Madigan/McCool and Sons was referred to the legal department for collection. No action taken.

Euro Style Stone has paid for their violation in full with a bank check. The company has fulfilled its obligation to the County.

Northern Comfort Mechanical was issued a violation for working without a license and pled guilty. They paid a reduced fine of \$1,250.00.

Frank Justo paid his fine of \$5,000.00 for covering. He has fulfilled his obligation to the County.

Christopher Ford had a check returned to the County as non-sufficient and has not taken care of the situation.

Findings of Fact were mailed to Angelo Prunella. This case was referred to the Putnam County Sheriff's Office for investigation, but it was determined that there was not enough evidence to proceed with any criminal charges. The DA's Office said that we should have allowed Mr. Prunella to come to the office with the fraudulent documents and submit them with his license request. This decision does not alter the civil penalties he was given. A final notice for payment was mailed to Mr. Prunella. His case is being referred to the legal department for collection. This item will be removed from future minutes.
